Lead Poisoning

Lead is used in various industries and in different forms. For example, there is lead paint, lead is in batteries, there is grinding plants and lead smelting, to name just a few of the uses. Lead is found in the water, air, soil, pipes, and many consumer products. If you are not issued the appropriate protective clothing, workers can be exposed to lead, leading to lead poisoning. The public can also be exposed to lead and children are especially susceptible.

There are regulations to protect workers from exposure to lead and other chemicals. If you believe that you have become ill as a result of exposure to lead or you may be entitled to personal injury compensation. While the statute of limitation can vary depending on where you are located, generally you must file the claim petition within two years from the date you are first diagnose with an lead related illness.

Symptoms of Lead Poisoning

In tiny doses lead can result in fatigue, overall aches and pains, and abdominal pain. However, in larger doses lead can cause vomiting, headache and much more serious symptoms. High concentrations of lead can lead to problems with your central nervous system, major organs, and it can even cause death. Dangerous exposure is rare, but it does happen.

If you believe you have been exposed to lead, the first thing you need to do is seek medical advice. There are tests to determine whether you have lead poisoning and there are treatments to help reduce the damage done.

Lemon Garlic Chicken

INGREDIENTS:

1 tablespoon olive oil 2 cloves garlic, minced 2 (6 ounce) chicken breasts 1/2 cup chicken broth 2 tablespoons lemon juice

DIRECTIONS:

1.Heat olive oil in a skillet over medium heat; cook and stir garlic until fragrant, about 1 minute.

- **2.** Add chicken and cook until browned, about 4 minutes per side.
- **3.** Pour broth over chicken and cover skillet; lower heat to low and simmer until chicken is no longer pink in the center, about 30 minutes. An instantread thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C). Transfer chicken to a plate, reserving broth mixture in the skillet.
- **4.** Pour lemon juice into broth mixture and simmer until liquid is reduced by 1/3, 2 to 3 minutes. Return chicken to the skillet and cook until heated through, 2 to 3 minutes per side. *Source:* www.allrecipes.com





THE 'GREAT ONE' AND THREE THINGS TO AVOID IN RETIREMENT
